# **DEAR KOOL BOIZ FOUNDATION PARTNERS**

Thanks for your support. Here are a few highlights from 2022.

### **Strategic Highlights**

2022 was another banner year for the Kool Boiz Foundation. Despite fundraising and program challenges coming out of Covid-19, we still managed to execute programs on a high level. Our Promising Men Mentoring program in partnership with the United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley included over 30 mentees and was expanded to Rayan Early College Middle School. We continued our monthly Virtual Empowerment Series with 50 participants. We selected one more Kool Boiz Foundation \$4,000 college scholarship scholar and awarded our very first \$2,000 trade school/non-credit scholarship.

### **Financial Highlights**

I'm pleased to say the Kool Boiz Foundation increased our fundraising efforts versus prior year once again. In 2021 we raised \$67,074 towards our programs and expenses. We've successfully increased our revenue to \$98,352 in 2022, a 47% increase.

### **Event Highlights**

The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Cigars and Sundresses event continues to be a great event for us raising \$3,896 for our programs. Our 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Holiday Party with a Purpose was also well attended with nearly 100 people despite a winter storm.

#### **Looking Ahead**

We are excited to begin the work of creating a business leadership and entrepreneur program. The program will help bring small businesses back to the city while promoting entrepreneurship. In addition, the foundation will host our 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Empowerment Golf Outing on Saturday, May 20, 2023 at Knoll Run Golf Course.

Through our college scholarships, mentoring programs, and youth empowerment conferences, we are building future leaders and entrepreneurs.

#### History

The Kool Boiz Foundation was founded in 2015. The organization's Board of Directors consists of current and former residents of Youngstown, Ohio who decided to form an organization with the sole purpose of giving back to the community that helped make them successful. The Kool Boiz Foundation is a 501c3 charitable organization that operates with integrity and complete transparency. Due to our commitment to transparency, we have been awarded the 2022 Platinum Seal of Transparency by GuideStar. Our impact in the community has been consistently growing since the execution of our first scholarship awarded in 2016, and our first mentoring program in 2016. We are the proud recipients of the United Way of Youngstown and Mahoning Valley Community Impact Award.

# **KBF COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS**

#### Kool Boiz Foundation \$4,000 College Scholarship Award

The Kool Boiz Foundation College Scholarships are awarded to African American males who plan to attend an accredited 2- or 4-year college or university. To apply, applicants must be a resident of Youngstown, be a graduating high school senior, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. The Kool Boiz Foundation College Scholarship is a \$1,000 4-year renewable scholarship (total award is \$4,000). Award recipients must maintain a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale and be enrolled as a full-time



student at an accredited 2- or 4-year college or university. Scholarship funds are paid directly to the college or university on the student's behalf and are paid in two installments.

In 2022, the Kool Boiz Foundation awarded one new college scholarship, our eighth scholarship awarded. JR Tellington, a graduate of Chaney High School was awarded this year's \$4,000 scholarship. JR is now attending Edinboro University.

### Kool Boiz Foundation \$2,000 Trade School/Non-Credit Scholarship Award

New for 2022, the Kool Boiz Foundation awarded a \$2,000 scholarship to an African American male planning to enroll in a skilled trade or credential program. The criteria for this scholarship is the same as our College Scholarship. This scholarship is for students who plan to earn a skilled trade or credential program (for example, barber school, welding, manufacturing, IT coding, etc.). The scholarship is a one-time award, up to \$2,000 not to exceed the cost of the program, including exam, fees, and credentialing.

The 2022 scholarship was awarded to David Ford Jr. David is enrolled at Beyond Expectations Barber School pursuing his barber license.

# **KBF PROMISING MEN MENTORING**

#### 2022 Promising Men Mentoring Details



The Kool Boiz Foundation in partnership with the United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley continues to empower boys and young men of color through our Promising Men Mentoring Program. The program is designed to help young men increase their educational skills, social skills, and leadership skills. In 2022, we continued our in person mentoring sessions at Youngstown Community School with 15

mentees in grades 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> and, we added another mentoring session at Rayen Early College Middle School with 15 mentees.

#### Mentoring Makes a Difference

Our mentoring program aims to change the mindsets and behaviors of the young men we serve and help them achieve success in all aspects of their lives. Research shows that youth who have high levels of developmental assistance achieve more and are involved in fewer high-risk behaviors. According to the National Cares Mentoring



Movement, when young people are mentored well, 98% stay in school; 98% do not become teen parents; 85% do not use drugs; and 98% avoid gang participation.

# KBF YOUNG MEN'S EMPOWERMENT CONFERENCE AND MONTHLY SERIES


#### 2022 Young Men's Empowerment Conference and Series Details



Our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Kool Boiz Foundation Young Men's Empowerment Conference was held Saturday, November 12, 2022, at Eastern Gateway Community College in Youngstown, Ohio. This conference was designed for boys and young men of color in grades 7 through 12 with a goal of exploring long-term success through education, leadership, life skills, and hard work. The conference gave young men an opportunity to hear about and reflect on "What's Possible" through thought-provoking interactive discussions and

workshops. Over 90 participants attended this free conference which ran from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm and included breakfast, lunch, and snacks for all participants.

The Kool Boiz Foundation's Young Men's Virtual Empowerment Conference Series continued in 2022. This series is a 1.5-hour virtual empowerment miniconference held via Zoom on the fourth Saturday of each month. These conferences started in February 2019 and has proven to be a powerful tool in helping the



young men we serve. The conferences are free for participants and incorporate a point system that rewards participates based on their monthly attendance and engagement. In 2022, the virtual conferences averaged 15 participants per month with a total of 50 different boys and young men of color participating.

### 2022 Kool Boiz Foundation Cigars and Sundresses Fundraiser



The 4<sup>th</sup> annual Cigars and Sundresses Fundraiser was held Saturday, August 6, 2022, at The Soap Gallery in downtown Youngstown. The goal of this event is to continue raising money for our mentoring programs, scholarship fund, and empowerment conference. Over 100 people participated in the

event, raising a net amount of \$3,896. The event featured live



entertainment by The Michael Austin Project and was presented in partnership with The Havana House, and A&C Beverage. This year's event was once again held outdoors under two tents in front of the Soap Gallery on Champion Street. Participants enjoyed dinner by a Fresh Wind Catering and participated in a Chinese Auction with gifts and baskets donated by local businesses.
